Moderately priced hotels like the Marriott, which has three locations in Park City, and a plethora of privately managed hotels fit most family budgets and needs. Almost all of them are on public transit routes, and they are all within riding range of at least one trailhead.

When budget is one of the most important considerations, Park City has plenty of economy hotels and condos from which to choose, most of which would be mid-level properties in other towns. In Park City, these locations simply offer a great escape at a great value, and are all very bike friendly.

With lodging options ranging from studios for a weekend getaway to luxurious rooms at hotels like the St. Regis, Park City has your daily jumping-off point covered.
