Mountain Biking in Park City, Utah

Always chasing a new way to “send it” defines the lofty ambitions of Park City’s mountain biking community. Named a Gold Level Ride Center by the International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA), there is certainly a reputation to uphold. Fortunately for Park City riders, the competitive spirit is always in play, and the drive to keep improving, growing, excelling – never rests.

Nearly four decades ago, Park City’s mountain biking scene was born. Recreational riders saw something bigger for the sport’s future and began to organize. With the support of passionate locals and Deer Valley Resort, an official trail system and the state’s first lift-access bike experience were up and running. The movement gained momentum, and Park City never looked back.

Today, an interconnected network of more than 450 miles of non-motorized trails sprawls over the Wasatch Back. Cross-country terrain, swoopy switchbacks, adventure-filled bike parks, and the arduous climbs that lead to euphoric descents make up the exceptionally versatile landscape of Park City’s mountain biking community.

When the snow melts and riders trade in their skis for pedals, new terrain awaits at Deer Valley Resort. Undertow, a 3-mile modern singletrack trail becomes the fourth flow trail at the resort. The latest addition is motivation enough for the newly upgraded Homestake Express chairlift to get moving, which connects mid-mountain and lower mountain trails and services.

For a little extra assistance on challenging terrain or to enjoy a more leisurely ride, guests can take advantage of the Summit Bike Share program, which allows guests to rent an electric pedal assist bike or e-bike, and cruise the county on their schedule. For the first time this summer, e-assist mountain biking tours will be offered by Park City’s White Pine Touring. These new, cutting-edge bikes allow riders to maximize their pedaling power and experience more mountain than ever before.

While summer in Park City is a local’s best-kept secret, professional mountain bikers are also taking notice. Decorated athletes whose rides take them to bucket-list riding destinations choose to call Park City home, and they serve as crucial advocates for a vibrant riding community.

Competitive spirit aside, it’s all about teamwork. Mountain Trails Foundation, Park City Municipal, Snyderville Basin Special Recreation District (Basin Rec), Deer Valley Resort and Park City Mountain, and Summit Land Conservancy partner to protect and strengthen Park City’s mountain biking offerings and set an example for riding communities worldwide.

Whether you’re a local, first-timer, or an expert looking for your next thrill, Park City offers an unrivaled experience. With a rich history, strong foundation, and passion to sustain our natural resources and travel amenities, Park City defines what it means to be a full-service mountain biking destination.


Three lifts provide bike access during the summer at Park City Mountain and are centrally located amongst some of Park City's most beautiful trails. The Payday lift will operate for early-season biking and hiking access beginning May 25 at the Park City Mountain Village.

The high-speed four-seat Crescent Lift also runs out of the Park City Mountain Village and unloads mountain bikers at access points for the IMBA Epic Ride on the Mid-Mountain Trail. The Red Pine Gondola runs out of Canyons Village and accesses miles of gorgeous cross-country trails. Bike rentals are available at both base areas. Where the pros ride

It's no surprise a number of pro-riders are proud to call Park City home thanks to the hundreds of miles of terrain accessible out their back door. After competing on the Slopestyle World Tour for eight years, Eric Porter now pursues adventure rides all over the world. Porter, who has partnerships with notable outdoor brands such as Diamondback Bikes, CLIF Bar, POC, and Camelbak to name a few, dedicates his time building awareness to mountain biking and demonstrating how to live a healthy lifestyle on two wheels. Although Porter's adventure rides take him around the globe, he remains a committed bike ambassador for the Wasatch Back's local riding community. Pro rider Evelyn Dong, winner of the Missoula XC, Go Pro Games Champion, overall winner at the Breck Epic MTB Stage Race, and competitor in the American National Championships and USA National Championships, uses Park City's terrain as her official training grounds. Utah native Nicole Tittensor, winner of the Marathon National Championships in her age group, has competed in the Elite Women's category since 2015. As a "privateer" traveling to competitions without a factory team, Tittensor is fittingly sponsored by Jans Park City, a testament to the community partnership between Park City's premier mountain adventure shop and its exceptional athletes.



Go with the flow

Deer Valley Resort, in collaboration with Gravity Logic, continues to reinvent mountain biking as we know it. The resort's flow trail initiative is designed to encourage families of all abilities to get out and ride together. Undertow is a new intermediate-blue flow trail on Bald Eagle Mountain. And, riders can access this 3-mile singletrack trail via Homestake Express chairlift, which is running for its first summer as a new high-speed quad lift connecting mid-mountain and the lower mountain terrain. Undertow joins beginner-green Holy Roller, intermediate-blue Tidal Wave, and expert-black Tsunami flow trails for an accessible riding experience for everyone.

For riders at Deer Valley looking for the most exciting thrills on the mountain, the E Track Trail bike delivers high performance, stable handling and a comfortable ride for all-day adventure. It's a full-suspension electric-assist bike that combines the power of a Shimano E8000 motor with the performance of the Split Pivot suspension design, delivering unrivaled performance on all trails. When climbing or descending, the E-Track Trail bike offers outstanding performance and comfort.



Humble beginnings to gold standard

The history of mountain biking in Park City runs deep. In the 1980s, weekly social rides evolved into a group of passionate riders eager to build trails that would be the foundation for Park City's vast trail network today. In 1992, Deer Valley offered Utah's first lift-served mountain biking experience and has continued to expand its trail access and services to riders ever since. Soon after, Mountain Trails Foundation was created with the mission to build, connect, and protect Park City's world-renowned trail system. With growing popularity, Park City began hosting events such as the NORBA National Mountain Bike Series and stages of the Tour of Utah, before earning its well-deserved recognition as the first gold-level ride center by the International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA).




WASATCH CREST AND MID MOUNTAIN TRAIL
